Lesson 222

"Ho! Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat. Yes, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price." Isaiah 55:1

This verse enraptured me the moment I first laid eyes on it. In my day, U.S. Marines received no monthly salary—just a stipend of a few dollars, most of which I sent home to help my poor parents. Yet, suddenly, I knew I was rich! The word "Ho" caught my attention.

It didn't take a rocket scientist to know God was about to say something important. He had something great for the thirsty and hungry that would cost no money and yet had to be bought. I knew immediately what the Lord had in mind - at least for me.
